IB Course Certificate Options

The following International Baccalaureate courses may be taken by students *not pursuing the full IB Diploma*. In these IB courses, students will take the same internal and external assessments as the IB Diploma Candidates and can earn college credit for passing IB assessments (3-12 hours depending on scores).

- IB English Literature HL (2 credit course, taken over 2 years)
- IB Spanish SL (1 year)
- **IB French** SL (1 year)
- IB History HL (2 credit course, taken over 2 years)
- IB Philosophy SL (1 year)
- IB Social & Cultural Anthropology SL (1 year)
- IB Environmental Systems and Societies SL (1 year)
- IB Physics SL (1 year)
- IB Biology SL (1 year)
- IB Math Applications & Interpretations HL (2 credit course, taken over 2 years)
- IB Math Analysis & Approaches HL (2 credit course, taken over 2 years)
- IB Film SL (1 year)
- IB Visual Arts HL (2 credit course, taken over 2 years)
- IB Visual Arts SL (1 year)
- IB Music SL (2 credit course, taken over 2 years)

IB at RHS

IB is a two-year academic program in which students engage in a variety of thought-provoking courses. Or, consider enrolling in selected **IB Courses** instead of the full Diploma Programme.

IB focuses on an **inquiry-based education** which provides students with a sense of **academic freedom**, encouraging **independent thinking** and self-exploration.

IB students learn time management and interpersonal skills that will benefit them in college and beyond. The classroom environment allows for different perspectives and encourages students to interact and collaborate with others.

While all advanced academic classes provide students with a vast scope of knowledge, IB courses challenge students to find a deeper understanding. Students are encouraged to explore the "what?" and "why?" questions, and express their ideas through open response writing exams.
